Dear Members

Welcome to the April edition of RA Today.

I write to you in the week before the culmination of the Highveld Autumn Season, Champions Day. Named very fittingly so, as there are 7 graded races due to be run on Saturday 1 May, as well as the inaugural James Maree Work Riders VS Jockeys Challenge Maiden Plate. The day will also see the launch of the 4Racing brand and we welcome their sponsorship of stakes, a total amount of R 750 000 over the 7 feature races.

This feature season has been a highlight, although Covid protocols have restricted on course participation, we have had the pleasure of crowning both a triple crown and a triple tiara winner during the month of April. This was the first time in history that such a feat had been achieved and our most sincere congratulations must go to all the connections of these two worthy champions. War of Athena, the Wilgerbosdrift Triple Tiara winner was awarded a bonus of R1 Million for her win, while Malmoos, the WSB Triple Crown winner took home a bonus cheque of R 2 Million on the day.

April 17th saw the running of the HSH Princess Charlene Empress Club Stakes where reigning Equus Horse of the Year,

Summer Pudding claimed her 11th victory from 12 starts. She certainly is writing her name in the history books along with the great "galloping goldmine" herself, Empress Club. Turn to page 2 for more on this very successful event.

A big thank you must go to all the sponsors who have generously contributed to stakes over the season. With Phumelela still under business rescue and having limited financial resources available, as well as 4Racing having only just received Competition Commission approval and still awaiting approval on the transfer of gambling licences, the support of sponsors across the board has helped to sustain racing over this period. The RA has begun engaging with 4Racing and are satisfied with the principles and processes suggested in a new stakes commitment. We look forward to a formal announcement once the new operator has been granted all the necessary regulatory approvals.

In May, we look to the Eastern Cape for more feature racing. The upcoming WSB East Cape Derby (L) to be run over 2400m takes place on Friday the 14th. The Dahlia Plate (L) and the Milkwood Stakes (L) follow later in the month at Fairview.



In conclusion, I would like to once again thank our owners, your resilience and constant support has enabled us to persevere through a year of many trials and tribulations in this industry. When we look back to a year ago, our future was most uncertain to say the least. We had just completed the first month of lockdown with no racing at all and Phumelela was about to announce their move into business rescue. We have managed to overcome these obstacles to a certain extent and make our way, a year later, to a more stable and steady environment. I hope these coming months steer us to even more solid ground as we prepare to build a sustainable future for the benefit of all the stakeholders in racing.

I wish you all an enjoyable months' racing and please do remember to stay safe.

This year, we will be donating funds to the United Cerebral Palsy Association of SA, The Hamlet Foundation and Lesabe Primary School.

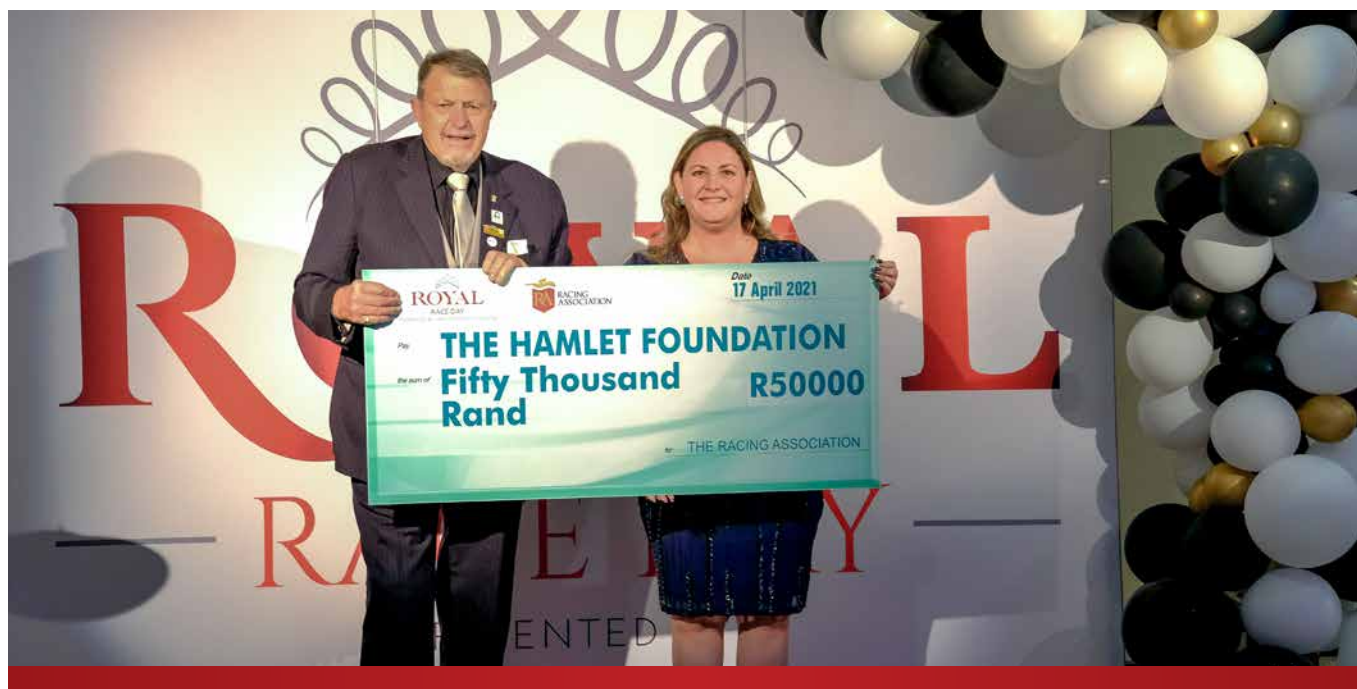
A big thank you must go to Mike Wittstock for all the hard work he has put in over the last few months, not only to make the day a success, but also for his tireless work in fundraising

UNITED CEREBRAL PALSY ASSOCIATION OF SOUTH AFRICA

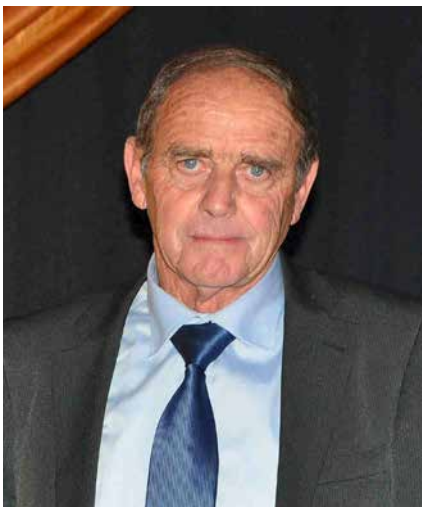
This Association implores the more fortunate South Africans to "Please Give With A Loving Heart".

About 40 severely mentally and physically handicapped children and young adults are cared for at the Harry Kessler Centre in Townsvlew, most of whom have been abandoned by their families. Cerebral Palsy occurs before, during or after birth when the brain is damaged through lack of oxygen. The severity of the disability means that the residents require constant care, intense therapy and stimulation to enable them to reach their maximum potential and lead happy and fulfilled lives.

The Work Riders' Training Programme

With the inaugural running of the **James Maree Work Riders VS Jockeys Challenge** on Saturday 1st May, we thought it appropriate to highlight some of the outstanding work James Maree has done over the last 15 years. The Racing Association, as support to The Racing Trust provides assistance and management services to the Work Riders Training Programme and as such, we have had first hand knowledge of his dedication to the industry.



James Maree's passion was to be in a position to educate, train and mentor grooms and work riders which would in turn, empower them to not only improve their lives but also have a substantial impact on their family's life. James started riding in 1961 and received his Jockey License in 1966. With his drive, optimism and always striving to be the best, he went on to become the South African Champion Jockey and was also runner up in the Summer Cup on 3 occasions. He continued by winning every major race in South Africa which included the July Handicap, Metropolitan, 5 Derby's, the Oaks and the Computaform Sprint. He continued

riding until his career came to an end when the horse he was riding "Hariba Hariba" broke both legs in a race, James dislocated both hips and subsequently had to have 3 hip replacements over the years. Later in life the racing industry awarded James with a Life Time Achievement Award. His vision was to create a programme where he would provide grooms with the necessary skills and tuition to become competent Work Riders, whereby, they would play a major role within the horseracing industry and more importantly, provide them with job satisfaction. His aim is to improve the work riders' abilities and experience in order for them to gain confidence whilst riding millions of rands worth of thoroughbred's every day during work riding. This programme became essential as it would benefit the previously disadvantaged individuals and specifically those who were unskilled or under-educated.

The Work Riders' Programme was thus established with the objective of improving grooms' and work riders' riding skills and also to identify talented individuals to move ahead in the industry. This empowerment programme is a joint venture between the Racing Trust, supported by the RA and James

Maree. Work riders are trained at James Maree's farm in Eikenhof and may qualify to ride in races once they have completed the required curriculum and passed the course. The programme has produced a number of work riders who have progressed to become professional jockeys, assistant trainers, head grooms as well as a number of work riders that have relocated abroad for work riding. These candidates have also been exposed to the broadcasting side of racing which has been very beneficial to them and created a balanced upliftment process. The high standards of the programme have been recognised by the National Horse Racing Authority and key stakeholders within the industry.

Tune in to DSTV Tellytrack channel 249 or follow on www.tellytrack.com to see James Maree honoured for his contributions to the work riders programme in the James Maree Work Riders VS Jockeys Challenge. The race will be a R150,000 Maiden Plate over 1160m and teams will each comprise the top 8 riders on the respective Highveld logs for the current racing season as at 31 March 2021. The work riders will receive a 3kg weight allowance from the professional jockeys.

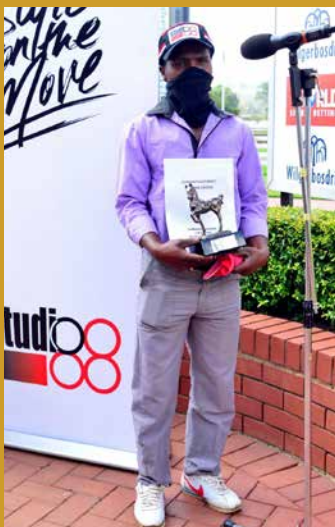

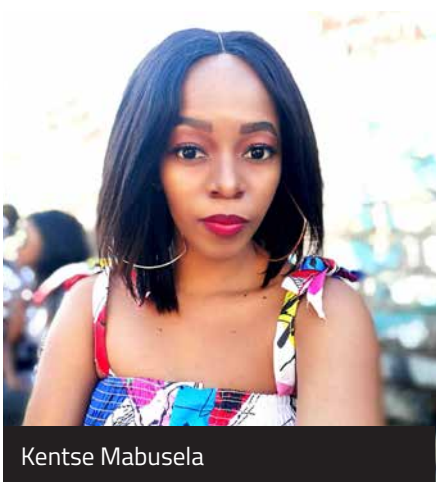
